Sec. 94-60. - Same—Fees established.

- (a) The following fees shall be charged by the city for the use of the rubbish disposal site:
 - (1) City residents who dispose of rubbish from their residence No charge
 - (2) Commercial, industrial, governmental or other entities located within the city or the county, per ton\$26.00
 - (3) County residents who dispose of rubbish from their residence, per ton\$26.00
 - (4) Other commercial, industrial, governmental, individual, or other entities located outside the county...Fees shall be as determined by mayor and board of aldermen.
 - (5) Minimum charge\$5.00
 - (6) Disposal of used tires with rims removed:

Four wheeler, boat trailer tires, etc., each\$0.50

Automobile and light truck tires, each\$1.00

Large truck tires, each\$5.00

Tractor, heavy equipment tires, each\$10.00

- (7) Disposal of used appliances, scrap metal means...There shall be no charge for disposal of used appliances. The hauler of such materials shall unload such in a location as directed by city personnel and shall place all appliances containing freon separate from other materials
- (b) The total charge to each customer shall be as determined by the net weight of each load on the basis of scale weight. In the event the scales become inoperable, the charge shall be on the basis of \$6.00 per cubic yard as measured by city sanitation department personnel.
- (c) Payment for use of the rubbish disposal site shall be by cash or check at the time of disposal, provided however, that upon request and approval by the city, monthly statements may be sent to governmental, commercial, industrial, or other entities. Charges to residents of the county residing outside the city, who dispose of rubbish from their own residence, may at the option of the board of supervisors of the county, be paid for by the county.
- (d) Any person, business, industry, agency or other entity who shall deposit unacceptable rubbish into the site shall be required to immediately remove such unacceptable rubbish from the site and shall be responsible for the cost of removal, transportation or proper disposal of such rubbish or any corrective action, remediation or penalty resulting therefrom. The city reserves the right to refuse to accept, in its entirety, any load containing unacceptable rubbish or other material.

- (a) Fees. The following monthly garbage collection fees are hereby established for each residential and commercial unit in the city:
 - (1) For each residential unit\$18.00
 - (2) For each commercial, industrial, governmental, or other entity:
 - a. With one four-yard dumpster, picked up one time per week53.00
 - b. With one four-yard dumpster, picked up two times per week95.00
 - c. With one four-yard dumpster, picked up three times per week143.00
 - d. With one four-yard dumpster, picked up four times per week191.00
 - e. With one four-yard dumpster, picked up five times per week239.00
 - f. With one four-yard dumpster, picked up six times per week287.00
 - g. With one six-yard dumpster, picked up one time per week76.00
 - h. With one six-yard dumpster, picked up two times per week130.00
 - i. With one six-yard dumpster, picked up three times per week183.00
 - j. With one six-yard dumpster, picked up four times per week244.00
 - k. With one six-yard dumpster, picked up five times per week305.00

 - (3) Minimum service: \$37.00 less than five bags per week or capable of sharing a dumpster that is equal to or greater than minimum dumpster charge. [2]
 - (4) The container must be removed and placed out of sight after collection day.
 - (5) Add an additional ten percent for city owned containers rounded to the nearest dollar.
 - (6) Other service means any other service shall be charged on an individual basis by assessing volume and operational cost.
- (b) Contracting with commercial hauler. Nothing in this section shall prohibit a commercial, industrial or governmental entity from contracting with a commercial hauler for hauling solid wastes. Any entity that contracts with a commercial hauler shall provide the City of Oxford with sufficient proof of such contract no later than five business days prior to the effective date of the contract. Upon receipt of such proof, appropriate adjustments shall be made in the monthly billing to such entity.

(c) Definitions. For the purposes of this section, a "residential unit" consists of a single-family unit, including those situated in any two-family or multi-family building or structure, and its accessory structures located on contiguous property; and a "business, commercial, industrial, or governmental entity" consists of a single business, commercial, industrial or governmental establishment and its accessory structures located on contiguous property.
