CONTRACT TO COLLECT MOTOR VEHICLE AD VALOREM TAXES

This agreement made and entered into on the date indicated below by and between the City of Oxford, Mississippi, a municipal corporation, hereinafter called "CITY" and the County of Lafayette, Mississippi, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY", on behalf of the Lafayette County Tax Assessor and Tax Collector, hereinafter referred to as "COLLECTOR".

Witnesseth:

DEMENT-MERIDIAN 54-724

Whereas, pursuant to the terms and provisions of Chapter 588, General Laws of Mississippi, 1958, and the amendments thereto, CITY has elected to prepare and has prepared for the taxable year beginning October 1, 1987, its separate assessments schedule of motor vehicles in the City of Oxford, Mississippi, and

Whereas, the previous tax collector of Lafayette County, Mississippi, has heretofore collected said ad valorem taxes for CITY, and COLLECTOR has experienced personnel and has the equipment and facilities with which to efficiently collect CITY'S taxes for the taxable year of 1987, and by virtue thereof, can collect said taxes more economically than could CITY, and

Whereas, the collections of ad valorem taxes on motor vehicles within the City of Oxford and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District will fall into the bracket established by said Chapter 588 of three percent (3%), which percentage if inadequate to meet the expenses of the collection of said taxes and, in order to induce COUNTY to assume the additional obligation of collecting its taxes, city is willing to increase the fee to the COUNTY to a flat-overall fee of five percent (5%) of the amount collected for the City of Oxford and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District; and

whereas, CITY is of the opinion that it would be the best

interest of the general public to pay COUNTY to collect motor vehicle and ad valorem taxes for the taxable year beginning October 1, 1987.

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NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual benefits to be derived here from the parties hereto do hereby mutually agree and bind themselves, as follows:

1. COUNTY agrees to have COLLECTOR collect for the taxable year beginning October 1, 1987, all ad valorem taxes due the City of Oxford and Oxford Municipal Separate School District on all motor vehicles on which he, as tax collector of Lafayette County, Mississippi, collects State and County ad valorem taxes. In determining the amount of tax to be collected on such vehicle, COLLECTOR shall use the valuation of the motor vehicles as set forth on the assessments schedule of said CITY, as amended, the levies to be made by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, on the 15th day of September, 1987, for municipal ad valorem taxes for said CITY and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District. All such taxes shall be collected by COLLECTOR as the same time such State and County ad valorem taxes are collected.

2. For having said taxes collected for CITY, CITY, shall pay to COUNTY as compensation for services rendered hereunder five percent (5%) of the total amount of such taxes collected by COLLECTOR at the time of the remittance of such collections to the CITY as hereinafter provided.

3. COUNTY agrees to faithfully account for and deliver to CITY all of the money collected by COLLECTOR, his employees, agents, servants, and clerks on behalf of CITY and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District on or before the 20th day of the month following that in which the funds are so collected, provided, however that in making said monthly settlements the COUNTY may deduct therefrom its compensation as provided in this agreement and account for the same at the time of such remittance.

4. COUNTY agrees to furnish CITY true and exact copies of

all reports required to be made to the motor vehicle comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Safety, and the State Tax Commission of

the State of Mississippi at the same time said reports are required

to be made to said Mississippi departments.

5. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to limit the right of the CITY to pursue, prosecute and enforce the payment of all ad valorem taxes and penalties by those who are delinquent, if any, and those who have made false representations, if any, or otherwise have evaded the payment of said taxes.

6. All of the applicable provisions of Chapter 588, General Laws of Mississippi, 1958, and the amendments thereto are hereby incorporated in this contract by reference to the same extend as if they were set forth herein for all purposes, except that where any of the provisions of said act conflict with or are different to the expressed provisions of this agreement, that the provisions hereof shall be binding on the parties hereto.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI, DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO PROVIDE ITS PRO RATA SHARE OF THE OPERATION OF THE OXFORD-LAFAYETTE COUNTY VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL CENTER (OXFORD-LAFAYETTE COUNTY BUSINESS AND INDUSTRIAL COMPLEX)

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Oxford Municipal Separate School District unanimously adopted a Resolution and Order requesting the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, to levy taxes in the amount of \$85,867.00 to assist in the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational Center (Oxford-Lafayette County Business and Industrial Complex) in order to enable the Oxford Municipal Separate School District to pay its pro rata share of the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational-Technical Center during the 1987-88 school session; and,

WHEREAS, the Oxford Municipal Separate School District, under agreement entered into by and between the Oxford Municipal Separate School District, dated September 28, 1971, is obligated to pay its pro rata share of the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational-Technical Center (Oxford-Lafavette County Business and Industrial Complex); and,

WHEREAS, as required by law, and particularly Section 37-7-409, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and amendments thereto, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen are required to make such levy as requested in said Resolution and Order of said Board of Trustees, and to declare its intention to do so by this Resolution, and as hereinafter provided, and in accord with said Section 37-7-409.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to the aforesaid Resolution and Order of the Board of Trustees of the Oxford Municipal Separate School District and as required by law, and particularly said Section 37-7-409, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen declare its intention to levy taxes in the amount of \$85,867.00 for the purpose of providing funds to said school district to assist in the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational-Technical Center (Oxford-Lafayette County Business and Industrial Complex) as provided by law and in particular said Section 37-7-409.

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Section 2: That this Mayor and Board of Aldermen proposes to make said

levy at a meeting of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen to be held on September 15,

1987, at 7:00 p.m. If twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of the

Oxford Municipal Separate School District shall file a petition against the

making of said levy herein provided for within the time specified in Section 3

The first publication of this Resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed in Section 2, of this Resolution for the making of said additional levy, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date. That if within fifteen (15) days after the final publication of the Resolution a petition signed by at least twenty percent of the qualified electors of the Oxford Municipal Separate School District requesting an election on the proposition of levying such additional taxes for school purposes is filed with the City Clerk of the City of Oxford, such levy shall not be made until an election shall be held to determine whether or not a majority of qualified electors of the Oxford Municipal Separate School District shall favor the additional levy for school purposes. If a majority of the qualified electors of the Oxford Municipal Separate School District voting in such election approves the levying of the additional taxes, then the levy shall be made within the manner, form and time as required by law. If no such petition is filed with the City Clerk of the City of Oxford, then said levy shall be made by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen in the manner, form and time as required by law. All as provided in said Section 37-7-409, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and amendments thereto.

Section 4: That the City Clerk shall be and she is hereby directed to

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obtain from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper, the customary Proof of

Publication of this Resolution, and shall have the same before the Mayor and

Board of Aldermen on the date specified in Section 2 of this Resolution.

City Clerk, Virginia Chrestman reported to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that a South Central Bell Representative has advised that the city can save approximately \$30,000.00 in telephone costs once the South Central Bell office converts to new equipment on August 14, 1987. 45

It was moved by Alderman Hudspeth, seconded by Alderman Reeves to authorize the Clerk to proceed to contact South Central Bell in this matter. All the Aldermen present voting aye, Mayor Leslie declared the motion carried.

AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT WITH FIRE DEPARTMENT:

It was moved by Alderman Hudspeth, seconded by Alderman Tatum to authorize the Mayor and Clerk to execute Modification of Agreement Concerning Fire Protection Between The City of Oxford, MS And The University of MS. All the Aldermen present voting aye, Mayor Leslie declared the motion carried.

MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT CONCERNING FIRE PROTECTION BETWEEN THE CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI, AND THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI

On July 17, 1986, an Agreement Concerning Fire Protection between the City of Oxford, Mississippi, ("City") and the University of Mississippi ("University")was entered into, wherein the City agreed to create a fire district embracing the campus of the University and agreed to furnish fire protection within that fire district in consideration for the University selling the City at a nominal price certain fire equipment, paying the City an annual fire protection fee, providing one GPM Pumper every 15 years, and sharing one-half of the lease-purchase cost of a high-rise ladder truck.

In Paragraph 3 of said Agreement, University promised to pay an annual fire protection fee of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) per year, in four equal quarterly installments of Eighteen Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$18,750) each, said equal quarterly payments being due on or before the first day of October, January, April and July of each year through June 30, 1993.

In Paragraph 5 of said Agreement, University and City agreed to acquire a high-rise ladder truck to be placed in service by July 1, 1987. University specifically agreed to pay an increased annual fire protection fee equal to one-half of the lease-purchase cost of said high-rise ladder truck financed on a seven-year lease purchase plan.

For and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10) cash in hand paid, and in further consideration of an increased level of fire protection offered by City, University and City do agree to modify the first paragraph

of numbered Paragraph 3 and all of Paragraph 5 of said Lease Agreement to read as follows:

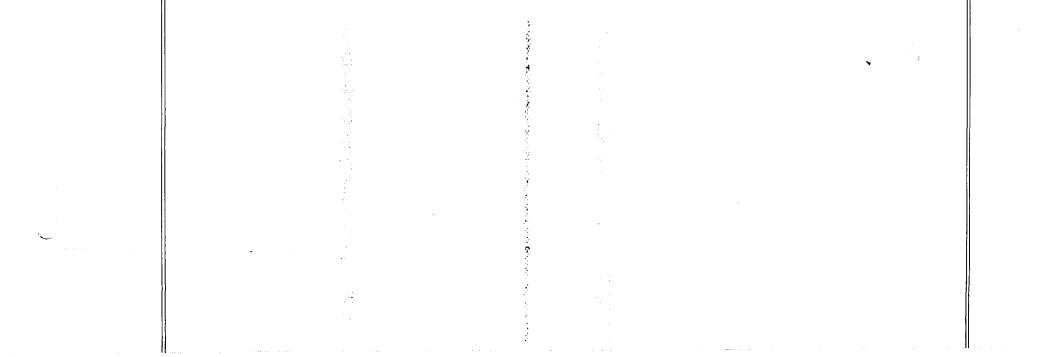

(3) University does further agree to pay unto the City of Oxford, Mississippi, an annual fire protection fee more particularly set forth in Paragraph 5 below in two semi-annual installments on or before the first day of July and January of each year through June 30, 1993.

(5) Both University and City agree that the fire protection program for City and University requires a high-rise ladder truck and that such ladder truck should be placed in service by July 1, 1987. University specifically agrees to pay an increased annual fee for fire protection service in an amount equal to one-half of the lease-purchase cost of said high-rise ladder truck financed on a five-year lease-purchase plan. The increased fire protection fee will be based on the increased level of service. Full ownership of the high-rise ladder truck will be vested in the City.

At the time of the execution of this Modification of the original Agreement, the acquisition of the high-rise ladder truck has been made and has resulted in improved fire protection to both the City and University. The cash acquisition price of this fire truck was Four Hundred Thirty-Nine Thousand Fifteen Dollars (\$439,015). The resulting annual fee of University for fire protection needs to be increased to the sum of One Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Four Hundred Forty-Two Dollars Fourteen Cents (\$134,442.14) per year for the period July 1, 1987, through June 30, 1992, thereafter reverting back to the basic fee of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) per year for the period July 1, 1992, through June 30, 1993.

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These payments represent those funds necessary to pay the basic fire protection fee of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) per year, plus Fifty-Three Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-Four Dollars and Sixty-Four Cents (\$53,954.64) per year to pay the University's fifty percent share of the lease-purchase finance cost for the ladder truck and the amount of Five Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$5,487.50) per year for University's one-half share of the annual insurance premium on the ladder truck as required by the financing agreement with Security Pacific Merchant Banking Group, 410 17th Street, Suite 1150, Denver, Colorado 80202. A copy of the budget support plan of University is attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference.

In all other respects, the original Agreement Concerning Fire Protection of July 17, 1986, shall remain the same.

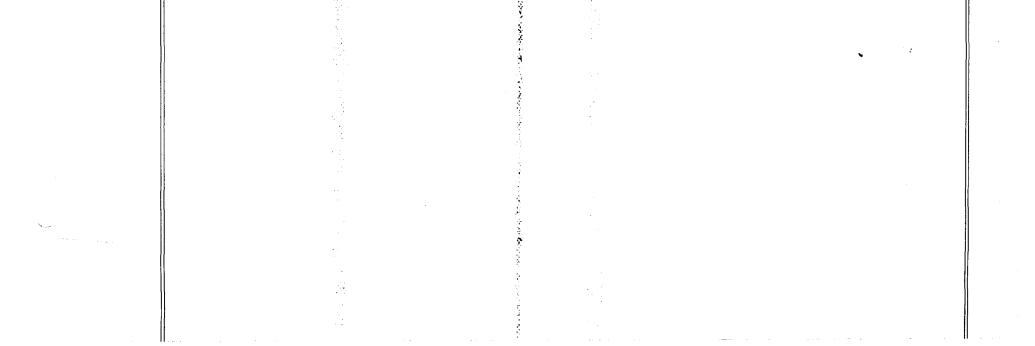

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Pursuant to the Notice of Special Meeting, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen did convene in the Courtroom when and where the following were present:

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The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, took up for further consideration the matter of the issuance of Revenue Bonds of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, in the principal amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000). After a discussion of the subject, Alderman <u>Hudspeth</u> offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE ISSUANCE OF REVENUE BONDS OF THE CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF AND/OR IMPROVEMENTS TO A BASEBALL STADIUM FACILITY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, acting for and on behalf of said City of Oxford, Mississippi, hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. (a) In addition to any words and terms elsewhere defined herein, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings, unless some other meaning is plainly intended:

"Act" shall mean House Bill 1189, Regular Session of the 1986 Mississippi State Legislature.

"Agent" shall mean any Paying Agent or Transfer Agent, whether serving in either or both capacities, and herein designated by the Governing Body.

"Bond" or "Bonds" shall mean the Series 1987 Revenue Bonds, of the Municipality authorized and directed to be issued in this resolution.

"Bond Counsel" shall mean Crosthwait, Terney & Noble, Jackson, Mississippi.

"Bond Fund" shall mean the fund of the Municipality provided for in Section 12 hereof.

"Bond Resolution" shall mean this resolution.

"Bond Year" shall mean the period from October 1 to September 30 in each year during which the Bonds are outstanding.

"Clerk" shall mean the City Clerk of the Municipality.

"Construction Fund" shall mean the 1987 Stadium Construction Fund of the Municipality provided for in Section 13 hereof.

"Governing Body" shall mean the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Municipality.

"Mayor" shall mean the Mayor of the Municipality.

"Municipality" shall mean the City of Oxford, Mississippi.

"Notice" shall mean the Notice of Bond Sale set out in Section 18 hereof.

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"Paying Agent" shall mean any bank, trust company or other institution hereafter designated by the Governing Body for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds.

"Person" shall mean an individual, partnership, corporation, trust or unincorporated organization and a government or agency or political subdivision thereof.

"Project" shall mean the construction and/or improvement to a baseball stadium facility at the University of Mississippi.

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"Purchaser" shall mean the successful bidder for the Bonds, to be hereafter designated by the Governing Body.

"Record Date" shall mean, as to interest payments, the 15th day of the month preceding the dates set for payment of interest on the Bonds and, as to payments of principal, the 15th day of the month preceding the maturity date thereof.

"Record Date Registered Owner" shall mean the Registered Owner as of the Record Date.

"Registered Owner" shall mean the Person whose name shall appear in the registration records of the Municipality maintained by the Transfer Agent.

"Transfer Agent" shall mean any bank, trust company or other institution hereafter designated by the Governing Body for the registration of owners of the Bonds and for the performance of such other duties as may be herein or hereafter specified by the Governing Body.

(b) Words of the masculine gender shall be deemed and construed to include correlative words of the feminine and neuter genders. Unless the context shall otherwise indicate, words and terms herein defined shall be equally applicable to the plural as well as the singular form of any of such words and terms.

2. That this Governing Body has heretofore by resolution adopted on April 1, 1986, (the "Resolution of Intent") expressed its intent to levy a sales tax in the amount of 2% on the gross receipts of restaurants derived from the retail sales of food, beer and alcoholic beverages and on the gross proceeds of other businesses derived from the retail sales of beer and alcoholic beverages excluding the sales of alcoholic beverages upon premises covered by package retailer's permit (the "Sales Tax").

3. The Resolution of Intent was published in <u>The Oxford</u> <u>Eagle</u> as required by law, said publication dates being April 11, 18, 25 and May 2, 1986.

4. On or before the hour of 7:00 p.m. on May 6, 1986, written protests against levying the Sales Tax containing 1,037 names of qualified electors were presented to the City Clerk which constituted 23.4 percent of all qualified electors within the City.

5. On April 16, 1987, the Governing Body adopted a resolution adjudicating that the written protest presented was sufficient and met the requirements of paragraph 2, Section 2 of the Act, and accordingly, an election was called on the question of whether the Sales Tax would be levied or not.

6. The notice of said election stating the date, place and purpose thereof was published in <u>The Oxford Eagle</u> as required by law, said publication dates being April 20, 27 and May 4, 11, 1987.

7. Said Special Election of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, was held in Oxford, Mississippi, on May 12, 1987. A majority of the qualified electors voted in favor of the proposition the results of the election being 748 for and 401 against, with 65% voting in favor, authorizing the City to levy the Sales Tax.

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8. The Governing Body on May 19, 1987, adopted a certain resolution entitled "RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE ITS REVENUE BONDS IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$3,000,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF AND/OR

IMPROVEMENTS TO A BASEBALL STADIUM FACILITY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI AND DIRECTING THE PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF THE CITY'S INTENTIONS TO ISSUE THE BONDS, ALL AS AUTHORIZED BY HB 1189, 1986 REGULAR SESSION OF THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE"; as required by law and as directed by the aforesaid resolution, the said resolution was published once a week for at least 4 consecutive weeks in <u>The Oxford Eagle</u>, a newspaper published and having a general circulation in the City of Oxford, Mississippi, and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972; the first publication of said resolution was made not less than 21 days prior to June 16, 1987; and the last publication was made not more than 7 days prior to said date, the date specified in said resolution upon which the Governing Body would take further action to provide for the issuance of said bonds, said notice being published in said newspaper on May 21 and 29 and June 4 and 11, 1987, as evidenced by the publisher's affidavit heretofore presented and filed;

9. At the hour of 7:00 p.m., on June 16, 1987, at the regular meeting place of the Governing Body at City Hall in the City of Oxford, Mississippi, the Clerk of the Governing Body (the "Clerk") announced to all present that no written petition or protest against the issuance of the Bonds had been presented and if anyone desired to present a written protest or petition against the issuance of the Bonds, to present said petition or protest at that time;

10. No petition or written protest against the issuance of said bonds of the Municipality was filed or presented.

11. Thereupon, the Governing Body on June 16, 1987, adopted a certain resolution authorizing the issuance of the Bonds pursuant to further resolution and proceedings of the Governing Body.

12. It has now become necessary to make provision for the preparation, execution and issuance of said bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY, ACTING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE MUNICIPALITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. In consideration of the purchase and acceptance of any and all of the Bonds by those who shall hold the same from time to time, this Bond Resolution shall constitute a contract between the Municipality and the Registered Owners from time to time of the Bonds. The pledge made herein and the covenants and agreements herein set forth to be performed on behalf of the Municipality shall be for the equal benefit, protection and security of the Registered Owners of any and all of the Bonds, all of which, regardless of the time or times of their authentication and delivery or maturity, shall be of equal rank without preference, priority or distinction.

SECTION 2. The Bonds are hereby authorized and ordered to be prepared and issued in the principal amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) to raise money for the Project as authorized by the Act.

SECTION 3. (a) Payments of interest on the Bonds shall be made to the Record Date Registered Owner, and payments of principal shall be made upon presentation and surrender thereof at the principal office of the Paying Agent to the Record Date Registered Owner in lawful money of the United States of America.

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(b) The Bonds shall be registered as to both principal and interest; shall be dated October 1, 1987; shall be issued in the denomination of \$5,000 each, or integral multiples thereof up to the amount of a single maturity; shall be numbered from one upward in the order of issuance; shall bear interest from the date thereof at the rate or rates specified by further order of

the Governing Body, payable on October 1 and April 1 of each year, commencing April 1, 1988; and shall mature and become due and payable on October 1 in the years and in the principal amounts as follows:

(c) Bonds maturing on October 1, 1998, and thereafter, are subject to redemption prior to their stated dates of maturity, either in whole or in part, in inverse order of maturity and by lot within a maturity on October 1, 1997, or on any interest payment date thereafter, at par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

(d) Notice of redemption identifying the numbers of Bonds or portions thereof to be redeemed shall be given to the Registered Owners thereof by first class mail at least 30 days and not more than 60 days prior to the date fixed for redemption.

SECTION 4. (a) When the bonds shall have been validated and executed as herein provided, they shall be registered as an limited obligation of the Municipality in the office of the Clerk in a book maintained for that purpose, and the Clerk shall cause to be imprinted upon the reverse side of each of the Bonds, over his facsimile signature and facsimile seal, his certificate in substantially the form set out in Section 6.

(b) The Bonds shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the manual or facsimile signature of the Clerk, with the seal of the Municipality imprinted or affixed thereto; provided, however all signatures and seals appearing on the Bonds, other than the signature of an authorized officer of the Transfer Agent hereafter provided for, may be facsimile and shall have the same force and effect as if manually signed or impressed. In case any official of the Municipality whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature shall appear on the Bonds shall cease to be such official before the delivery or reissuance thereof, such signature or such facsimile shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such official had remained in office until delivery or reissuance.

(c) The Bonds shall be delivered to the Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price therefor in accordance with the terms and conditions of their sale and award, together with a complete certified transcript of the proceedings had and done in the matter of the authorization, issuance, sale and validation of the Bonds, and the final, unqualified approving opinion of Bond Counsel, which opinion shall be imprinted on the reverse of each of the Bonds.

(d) Prior to or simultaneously with the delivery by τηε Transfer Agent of any of the Bonds, the Municipality shall file with the Transfer Agent:

(i) a copy, certified by the Clerk, of the transcript of proceedings of the Governing Body in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale and validation of the Bonds; and

(ii) an authorization to the Transfer Agent, signed by the Mayor, to authenticate and deliver the Bonds to the Purchaser.

(e) At delivery, the Transfer Agent shall authenticate the Bonds and deliver them to the Purchaser thereof upon payment of the purchase price of the Bonds to the Municipality.

Certificates, blank as to denomination, rate of (f) interest, date of maturity and CUSIP number and sufficient in quantity in the judgment of the Municipality to meet the reasonable transfer and reissuance needs on the Bonds, shall be printed and delivered to the Transfer Agent in generally-accepted format, and held by the Transfer Agent until needed for transfer or reissuance, whereupon the Transfer Agent shall imprint the appropriate information as to denomination, rate of interest, date of maturity and CUSIP number prior to the registration, authentication and delivery thereof to the transferee holder. The Transfer Agent is hereby authorized upon the approval of the Governing Body to have printed from time to time as necessary additional certificates bearing the facsimile seal of the Municipality and facsimile signatures of the persons who were the officials of the Governing Body as of the date of original issue of the Bonds.

SECTION 5. (a) The Governing Body will appoint a bank to serve as Paying Agent and Transfer Agent for the Bonds, after receiving the recommendation of the successful bidder. The Municipality specifically reserves the right to hereafter designate a separate Transfer Agent and/or Paying Agent in its discretion in the manner hereinafter provided.

(b) So long as any of the Bonds shall remain outstanding, the Municipality shall maintain with the Transfer Agent records for the registration and transfer of the Bonds. The Transfer Agent is hereby appointed registrar for the Bonds, in which capacity the Transfer Agent shall register in such records and permit to be transferred thereon, under such reasonable regulations as may be prescribed, any Bond entitled to registration or transfer.

(c) The Municipality shall pay or reimburse the Agent for reasonable fees for the performance of the services normally rendered and the incurring of normal expenses reasonably and necessarily paid as are customarily paid to paying agents, transfer agents and bond registrars, subject to agreement between the Municipality and the Agent. Fees and reimbursements for extraordinary services and expenses, so long as not occasioned by the negligence, misconduct or willful default of the Agent, shall be made by the Municipality on a case-by-case basis, subject, where not prevented by emergency or other exigent circumstances, to the prior written approval of the Governing Body.

(d) (i) An Agent may at any time resign and be discharged of the duties and obligations of either the function of the Paying Agent or Transfer Agent, or both, by giving at least sixty (60) days' written notice to the Municipality, and may be removed from either or both of said functions at any time by resolution of the Governing Body delivered to the Agent. The resolution shall specify the date on which such removal shall take effect and the name and address of the successor Agent, and shall be transmitted to the Agent being removed within a reasonable time prior to the effective date thereof. Provided, however, that no resignation or removal of an Agent shall become effective until a successor Agent has been appointed pursuant to the Bond Resolution.

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(ii) Upon receiving notice of the resignation of an Agent, the Municipality shall promptly appoint a successor Agent by

resolution of the Governing Body. Any appointment of a successor Agent shall become effective upon acceptance of appointment by the successor Agent. If no successor Agent shall have been so appointed and have accepted appointment within thirty (30) days after the notice of resignation, the resigning Agent may petition any court of competent jurisdiction for the appointment of a successor Agent, which court may thereupon, after such notice as it may deem appropriate, appoint a successor Agent.

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(iii) In the event of a change of Agents, the predecessor Agent shall cease to be custodian of any funds held pursuant to this Bond Resolution in connection with its role as such Agent, and the successor Agent shall become such custodian; provided, however, that before any such delivery is required to be made, all fees, advances and expenses of the retiring or removed Agent shall be fully paid. Every predecessor Agent shall deliver to its successor Agent all records of account, registration records, lists of Registered Owners and all other records, documents and instruments relating to its duties as such Agent.

(iv) Any successor Agent appointed under the provisions hereof shall be a bank, trust company or national banking association having Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation insurance of its accounts, duly authorized to exercise corporate trust powers and subject to examination by and in good standing with the federal and/or state regulatory authorities under the jurisdiction of which it falls.

(v) Every successor Agent appointed hereunder shall execute, acknowledge and deliver to its predecessor Agent and to the Municipality an instrument in writing accepting such appointment hereunder, and thereupon such successor Agent, without any further act, shall become fully vested with all the rights, immunities and powers, and subject to all the duties and obligations, of its predecessor.

(vi) Should any transfer, assignment or instrument in writing be required by any successor Agent from the Municipality to more fully and certainly vest in such successor Agent the estates, rights, powers and duties hereby vested or intended to be vested in the predecessor Agent, any such transfer, assignment and written instruments shall, on request, be executed, acknowledged and delivered by the Municipality.

(vii) The Municipality will provide any successor Agent with certified copies of all resolutions, orders and other proceedings adopted by the Governing Body relating to the Bonds.

(viii) All duties and obligations imposed hereby on an Agent or successor Agent shall terminate upon the accomplishment of all duties, obligations and responsibilities imposed by law or required to be performed by this Bond Resolution.

(e) Any corporate or association into which an Agent may be converted or merged, or with which it may be consolidated or to which it may sell or transfer its assets as a whole or substantially as a whole, or any corporation or association resulting from any such conversion, sale, merger, consolidation or transfer to which it is a party, shall be and become successor Agent hereunder and vested with all the powers, discretions, immunities, privileges and all other matters as was its predecessor, without the execution or filing of any instrument or any further act, deed or conveyance on the part of either the 59

Municipality or the successor Agent, anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, provided only that such successor Agent shall be satisfactory to the Municipality and eligible under the provisions of Section 5(d) (iv) hereof.

Bonds maturing on October 1, 1998, and thereafter, are subject to redemption prior to their stated dates of maturity, either in whole or in part, in inverse order of maturity and by lot within a maturity on October 1, 1997, or on any interest payment date thereafter, at par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

The Bonds are registered as to both principal and interest. The Bonds are to be issued or reissued in the denomination of \$5,000 each, or integral multiples thereof up to the amount of a single maturity.

This bond may be transferred or exchanged by the registered owner hereof in person or by his attorney duly authorized in writing at the principal office of the Transfer Agent, but only in the manner, subject to the limitations in the Bond Resolution, and upon surrender and cancellation of this bond. Upon such transfer or exchange, a new bond or bonds of like aggregate principal amount in authorized denominations of the same maturity will be issued.

The Governing Body of the Municipality has covenanted and agreed and does hereby covenant and agree to continue to levy the Sales Tax and not to discontinue or decrease or permit to be discontinued or decreased the Sales Tax in anticipation of the collection of which this Bond and the issue of which it forms a part have been issued, nor in any way make any change which would diminish the amount of said Sales Tax revenues pledged to the payment of the Bonds, until all of such Bonds have been paid in principal and interest. For a complete statement of the revenues from which and conditions under which

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this Bond is issued, reference is hereby made to the Bond Resolution.

In the event that the principal and interest due on the Bonds during any Bond Year exceeds the amount of \$200,000, then in such event, and in such event only, the University of Mississippi has guaranteed the payment of such amount of principal and interest due in excess of \$200,000 pursuant to a Guaranty Agreement by and between the University of Mississippi

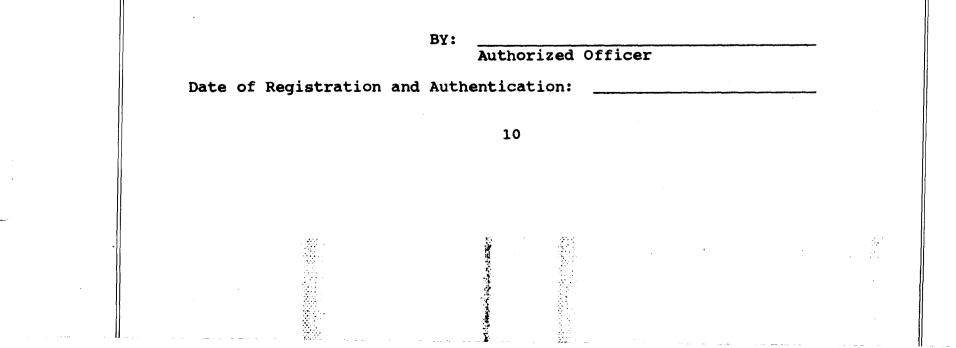

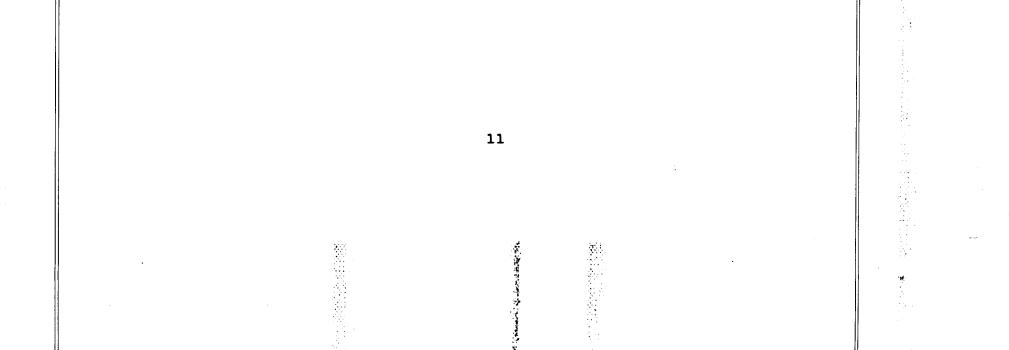

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SECTION 7. In case any Bond shall become mutilated or be stolen, destroyed or lost, the Municipality shall, if not then prohibited by law, cause to be authenticated and delivered a new Bond of like date, number, maturity and tenor in exchange and substitution for and upon cancellation of such mutilated Bond, or in lieu of and in substitution for such Bond stolen, destroyed or lost, upon the Registered Owner's paying the reasonable expenses and charges of the Municipality in connection therewith, and in case of a Bond stolen, destroyed or lost, his filing with the Municipality or Transfer Agent evidence satisfactory to them that such Bond was stolen, destroyed or lost, and of his ownership thereof, and furnishing the Municipality or Transfer Agent with such security or indemnity as may be required by law or by them to save each of them harmless from all risks, however remote.

(a) The Bonds shall be secured by and payable in principal and interest solely from an irrevocable pledge and dedication of a portion of the proceeds of the Sales Tax being levied and collected by the Municipality pursuant to the provisions of the Act and in compliance with a special election held therein on May 12, 1987. Proceeds of said Sales Tax in the amount of \$200,000 annually are hereby irrevocably pledged and dedicated for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same shall respectively mature and accrue. The proceeds of said Sales Tax in the amount of \$200,000 annually shall be set aside in a separate fund, as hereinafter provided, and shall be and remain pledged and dedicated for the security and payment of the Bonds in principal and interest and for all other payments provided for in this Bond Resolution until the Bonds have been fully paid and discharged.

The Municipality does hereby obligate itself and is (b) bound under the terms and provisions of law to levy, impose, enforce and collect or cause to be collected the Sales Tax and to provide for all, reasonable and necessary rules, regulations, procedures and penalties in connection therewith, including the proper application of the proceeds of the Sales Tax, until all of the Bonds have been retired as to both principal and interest. The Resolution imposing the Sales Tax and pursuant to which the Sales Tax is being levied, collected and allocated, and the obligations to continue to levy, collect and allocate the Sales Tax and to apply the revenues therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Bond Resolution, shall be irrevocable until the Bonds have been paid in full as to both principal and interest, and shall not be subject to amendment in any manner which would impair the rights of the Registered Owners from time to time of the Bonds or which would in any way jeopardize the prompt payment of principal thereof and interest thereon. More specifically, neither the Legislature of Mississippi nor the Municipality may discontinue or decrease the Sales Tax or permit to be discontinued or decreased the Sales Tax in anticipation of the collection of which the Bonds have been issued, or in any way make any change which would diminish the amount of the Sales Tax revenues pledged to the payment of the Bonds and received by the Municipality, until all of such Bonds shall have been retired as to both principal and interest.

(c) In the event that the principal and interest due on the Bonds during any Bond Year exceeds the amount of \$200,000, then in such event, and in such event only, the University of Mississippi has guaranteed the payment of such amount of principal and interest due in excess of \$200,000 pursuant to a Guaranty Agreement by and between the University of Mississippi and the Municipality; provided, however, if funds are available in the Bond Fund in an amount sufficient to pay the amount of principal and interest due in excess of \$200,000, then such excess shall be paid from said funds available in the Bond Fund without resort to the guarantee by the University of Mississippi pursuant to the Guaranty Agreement. 65

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SECTION 9. Only such of the Bonds as shall have endorsed thereon a certificate of registration and authentication in substantially the form hereinabove set forth, duly executed by the Transfer Agent, shall be entitled to the rights, benefits and security of this Bond Resolution. No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose unless and until such certificate of registration and authentication shall have been duly executed by the Transfer Agent, which executed certificate shall be conclusive evidence of registration, authentication and delivery under this Bond Resolution. The Transfer Agent's certificate of registration and authentication on any Bond shall be deemed to have been duly executed if signed by an authorized officer of the Transfer Agent, but it shall not be necessary that the same officer sign said certificate on all of the Bonds that may be issued hereunder at any one time.

SECTION 10. into the Bond Fund as and when received:

(i) The accrued interest and premium, if any, received upon delivery of the Bonds.

(ii) The proceeds of the Sales Tax levied and collected as described in Section 8 hereof, in the amount of \$200,000 annually;

(iii) Any income received from investment of monies in the Bond Fund; and

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(iv) Any other funds available to the Municipality, including monies made available pursuant to the Guaranty Agreement, which may be lawfully used for payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, and which the Governing Body, in its discretion, may direct to be deposited into the Bond Fund.

(b) As long as any principal of and interest on the Bonds remains outstanding, the Clerk is hereby irrevocably authorized and directed to withdraw from the Bond Fund sufficient monies to make the payments herein provided for and to transfer same to the account of the Paying Agent in time to reach said Paying Agent at least five (5) days prior to the date on which said interest or principal and interest shall become due.

SECTION 13. The principal proceeds received upon the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited with a qualified depository of the Municipality in a special fund, hereby created, in the name of the Municipality designated the "Series 1987 Revenue Bonds Stadium Construction Fund (the "Construction Fund"). From the Construction Fund there shall be first paid the costs, fees and expenses incurred by the Municipality in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale, validation and delivery of the Bonds. The balance thereof shall be held and disbursed for the Project, as authorized by the Act.

SECTION 14. (a) Payment of principal on the Bonds shall be made, upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds at the principal office of the Paying Agent, to the Record Date Registered Owner thereof who shall appear in the registration records of the Municipality maintained by the Transfer Agent as of the Record Date.

(b) Payment of each installment of interest on the Bonds shall be made to the Record Date Registered Owner thereof whose name shall appear in the registration records of the Municipality maintained by the Transfer Agent as of the Record Date. Interest shall be payable in the aforesaid manner irrespective of any transfer or exchange of such Bond subsequent to the Record Date and prior to the due date of the interest.

(c) Principal of and interest on the Bonds shall be paid by check or draft mailed to Registered Owners at the addresses appearing in the registration records of the Transfer Agent. 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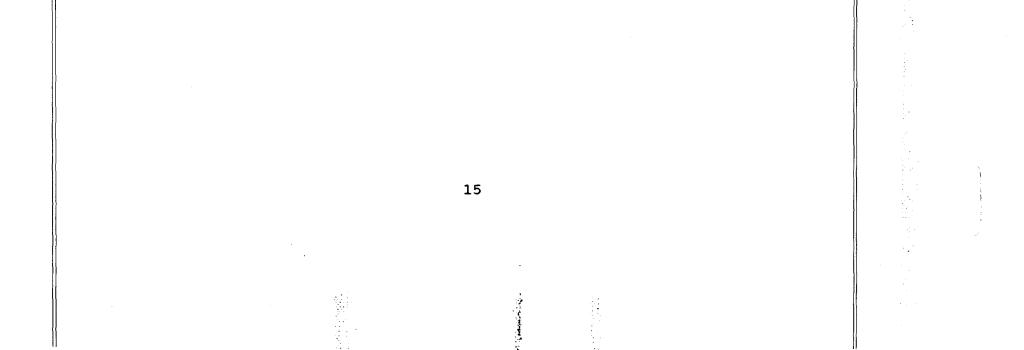

Bonds maturing on October 1, 1998, and thereafter, are subject to redemption prior to their stated dates of maturity, either in or in part, in inverse order of maturity and by lot within a maturity on October 1, 1997, or on any interest payment date thereafter, at par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

I realize a rate increase is never welcome news; however, to keep this case financially sound requires the above renewal action. Please bear in mind that this is the first rate increase since the case was written on 9/1/84, and that you received a dividend last year. In addition, the new rates are only 8% higher than the original rates in 1984. Considering all factors, that is a pretty good record.

WHEREAS, on August 4, 1987, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the of Oxford, Mississippi, unanimously adopted a resolution declaring its intention to provide its pro rata share of the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational Technical Center (Oxford-Lafayette County Business and Industrial Complex) in order to enable the Oxford Municipal Separate School District to pay its pro-rata share of the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational-Technical Center during the 1987-88 school session; and,

WHEREAS, said resolution was passed as required by and pursuant to law, and particularly Section 37-7-409 Mississippi Code of 1942, annotated, and amendments thereof; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to said resolution, the City Clerk caused the same to be published in its entirety in The Oxford Eagle, a newspaper published and of general circulation in the City of Oxford, said resolution having been published on August 24, 31, and September 7, 14, 1987.

WHEREAS, the City Clerk reported that no protests or objections or petitions of any kind or character whatsoever were made or filed against the making of the proposed levy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby determine to levy additional taxes in the amount of 1.85 Mills to assist in the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational-Technical Center (Oxford-Lafayette County Business and Industrial Complex) in order to enable the Oxford Municipal Separate School District to pay its pro-rata share of the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational-Technical Center during the 1987-88 school session.

Section 2. That such levy shall be made and collected within the manner, form and time as required by law, as provided in Section 37-7-409,

Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and amendments thereto.

Section 3. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen find that due to

the Oxford Municipal Separate School District's current responsibility to

pay its pro-rata share of the operation of the Oxford-Lafayette County Vocational-Technical Center during the 1987-88 school session and due to the shortness of the time in which to collect taxes for the Oxford Municipal Separate School District, it is necessary to the public health, safety and welfare that this resolution take effect immediately from and after its adoption.

The motion to adopt the foregoing resolution was duly seconded and the motion having received the affirmative vote of all of the members of the Board of Aldermen present, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted, this the 15th day of September, 1987.

DAVIS, an individual hereinafter referred to as "DEVELOPER".

1. The "City" agrees to install a sanitary sewer line from the North end of West Loop to the first manhole South of Anderson Road. The "Developer" will furnish all manholes, pipes, manhole covers, ductile iron pipe, and all materials for the installation. Said sewer line upon completion shall be dedicated to the City with a minimum of a twenty (20) foot easement.

5. Both the "City" and the "Developer" agree that all the above work shall be completed within one (1) year from the date of this agreement.

6. This agreement shall be binding on the "City" and the "Developer" and/or their respective successors in title.

Under the authority of Section 49-2-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, the above styled cause came on this date for consideration and the Executive Director, having heard and considered the same, finds as follows:

1.

The Respondent, City of Oxford, operates a sanitary landfill in Section 5, Township 9S, Range 3W, Lafayette County and, as such, is subject to the provisions of laws of this State governing the disposal of solid waste, the same appearing as Section 17-17-1, et. seq., and the rules and regulations of the Mississippi Commission on Natural Resources.

2.

Respondent is authorized under Permit No. SW03601B0174 issued by the Mississippi Natural Resources Permit Board on September 1, 1981, to operate a solid waste management facility in accordance with the State of Mississippi Nonhazardous Waste Regulations.

On January 21, 1988, an inspection of the Oxford Sanitary

Landfill revealed conditions of inadequate daily cover, unconfined dumping over a larger area than practical, scattered litter over the landfill property, and ponding of water in the completed areas

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of the landfill. These conditions are apparent violations of Section D.11, D.8, D.9, and D.19, respectively.

4.

A letter dated January 25, 1988 was sent to Mayor John Leslie of the City of Oxford noting the specific problems and requesting that the conditions be corrected.

5.

A follow-up inspection on March 10, 1988 indicated that there was little improvement in the conditions noted at the previous inspection.

6.

Premises considered, the Executive Director finds that Respondent has failed to comply with Sections D.8, D.9, D.11 and D.19 of the State of Mississippi Nonhazardous Waste Regulations.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the Respondent, the City of Oxford, shall immediately begin covering all existing exposed garbage on-site and shall begin a program whereby all incoming garbage is adequately compacted and covered by the close of each day. In addition, all incoming garbage shall be unloaded and confined to as small an area as practical. Also, all windblown and scattered litter shall be retrieved, returned to the active disposal area and properly covered. Furthermore, ponding of water in the completed area of the landfill shall be alleviated by properly compacting and grading the cover material to achieve proper drainage. However, the final cover gradient on the top of the fill shall not normally exceed 4 percent and on the side slopes shall not normally exceed 25 percent.

Finally, the conditions of this order unless otherwise

specified shall be accomplished within 45 days of the date of this

order.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that Respondent, if

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CONTRACT TO COLLECT MOTOR VEHICLE AD VALOREM TAXES

This agreement made and entered into on the date indicated below by and between the City of Oxford, Mississippi, a municipal corporation, hereinafter called "CITY" and the County of Lafayette, Mississippi, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY", on behalf of the Lafayette County Tax Assessor and Tax Collector, hereinafter referred to as "COLLECTOR".

Witnesseth:

Whereas, pursuant to the terms and provisions of Chapter 588, General Laws of Mississippi, 1958, and the amendments thereto, CITY has elected to prepare and has prepared for the taxable year beginning October 1, 1988, its separate assessments schedule of motor vehicles in the City of Oxford, Mississippi, and

Whereas, the previous tax collector of Lafayette County, Mississippi, has heretofore collected said ad valorem taxes for CITY, and COLLECTOR has experienced personnel and has the equipment and facilities with which to efficiently collect CITY'S taxes for the taxable year of 1988 and by virtue thereof, can collect said taxes more economically than could CITY, and

Whereas, the collections of ad valorem taxes on motor vehicles within the City of Oxford and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District will fall into the bracket established by said Chapter 588 of three percent (3%), which percentage if inadequate to meet the expenses of the collection of said taxes and, in order to induce COUNTY to assume the additional obligation of collecting its taxes, city is willing to increase the fee to the COUNTY to a flat-overall fee of five percent (5%) of the amount collected for the City of Oxford and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District; and

Whereas, CITY is of the opinion that it would be the best

interest of the general public to pay COUNTY to collect motor vehicle

and ad valorem taxes for the taxable year beginning October 1, 1988.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual benefits to be derived here from the parties hereto do hereby mutually agree and bind themselves, as follows:

1. COUNTY agrees to have COLLECTOR collect for the taxable year beginning October 1, 1988, all ad valorem taxes due the City of Oxford and Oxford Municipal Separate School District on all motor vehicles on which he, as tax collector of Lafayette County, Mississippi, collects State and County ad valorem taxes. In determining the amount of tax to be collected on such vehicle, COLLECTOR shall use the valuation of the motor vehicles as set forth on the assessments schedule of said CITY, as amended, the levies to be made by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, on the 6th day of September, 1988, for municipal ad valorem taxes for said CITY and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District. All such taxes shall be collected by COLLECTOR as the same time such State and County ad valorem taxes are collected.

2. For having said taxes collected for CITY, CITY, shall pay to COUNTY as compensation for services rendered hereunder five percent (5%) of the total amount of such taxes collected by COLLECTOR at the time of the remittance of such collections to the CITY as hereinafter provided.

3. COUNTY agrees to faithfully account for and deliver to CITY all of the money collected by COLLECTOR, his employees, agents, servants, and clerks on behalf of CITY and the Oxford Municipal Separate School District on or before the 20th day of the month following that in which the funds are so collected, provided, however, that in making said monthly settlements the COUNTY may deduct therefrom its compensation as provided in this agreement and account for the same at the time of such remittance.

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4. COUNTY agrees to furnish CITY true and exact copies of all reports required to be made to the motor vehicle comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Safety, and the State Tax Commission of the State of Mississippi at the same time said reports are required to be made to said Mississippi departments.

Nothing herein contained shall be construed to limit the right of the CITY to pursue, prosecute and enforce the payment of all ad valorem taxes and penalties by those who are delinquent, if any, and those who have made false representations, if any, or otherwise have evaded the payment of said taxes.

6. 1. Developer shall install all water and sewer lines in accordance with City Specifications for installation of water and sewer lines and Developer shall bear all expenses associated with such construction. All water and sewer lines shall be dedicated to the City by Developer.

All lines shall be installed within the right-of-way of College Hill Road (except short section of force main from lift station to manhole) and Developer shall obtain all easements from the Lafayette County Board of Supervisors or proper parties in the name of the City Easements for the force main, lift station and access to the lift station shall be given to the City by the Developer at no expense to the City. 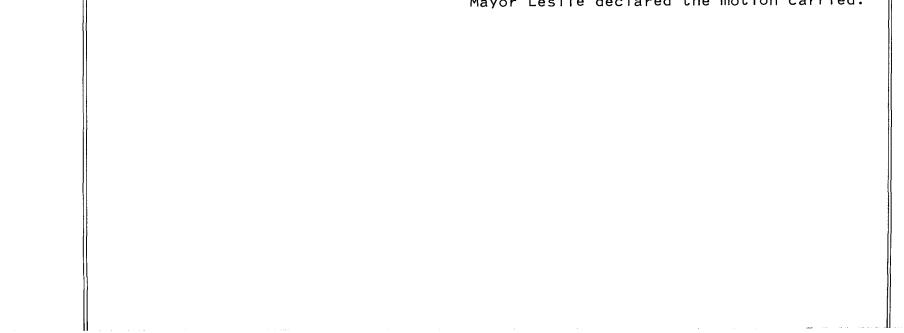

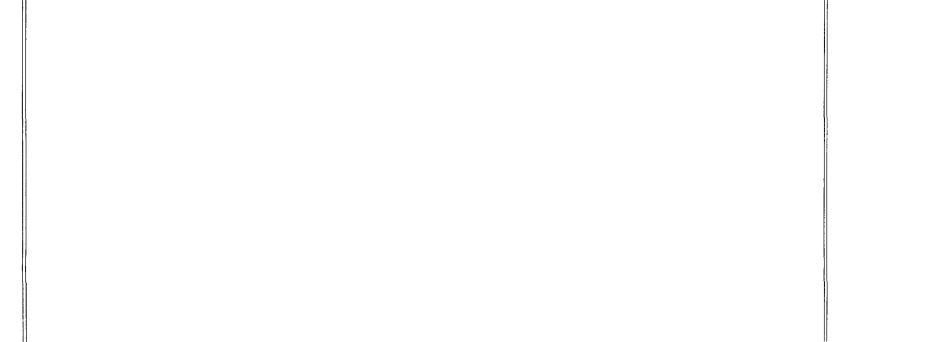

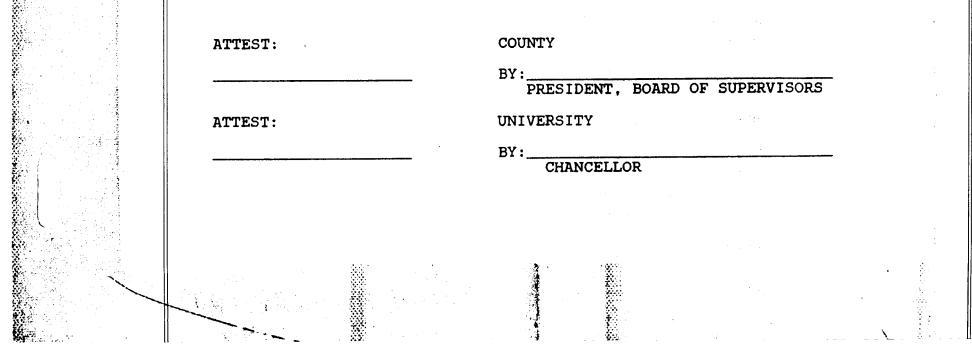

DRAFT CONTRACT BETWEEN THE OXFORD TOURISM COUNCIL AND THE CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, an Act of the Mississippi State Legislature authorizes the governing authority of the City of Oxford, Mississippi ("city") to levy a "motel-hotel tax" the proceeds of which shall be expended to promote tourism and economic development within the Oxford area, and

WHEREAS, the Act also creates, and establishes the Oxford Tourism Council ("council"), and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the city to contract with the council for the administrative responsibilities of a tourism program for the Oxford area,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants recited and for other good and valuable consideration, the **city** and **council** agree on this the day of , 1988, as follows:

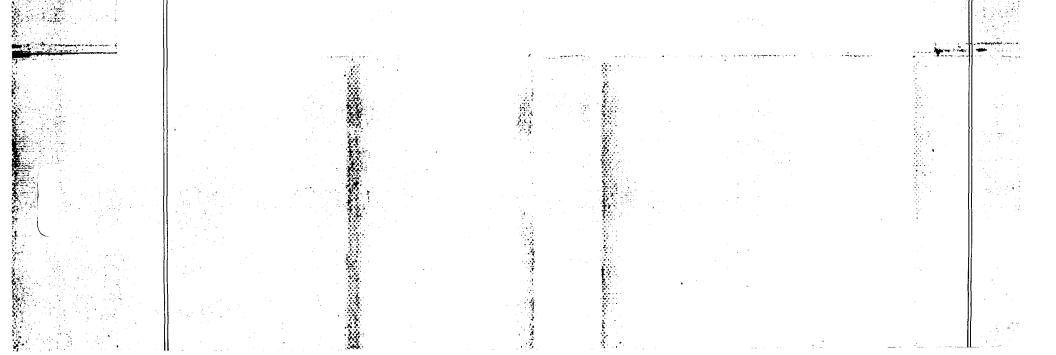
1. The **council** shall function as an independent agent and shall work in cooperation with the **city** in carrying out programs and activities designed to attract tourists to the Oxford area.

2. The council shall have jurisdiction and authority over all matters relating to establishing, promoting and developing tourism along with related matters in the Oxford area. The council shall be authorized to own, lease, rent or otherwise furnish, equip and operate any and all facilities and equipment necessary or useful in the promotion of tourism and economic development and to receive and expend transfers of "motel-hotel tax" monies from the city and revenues from other sources.

3. The council shall be composed of seven (7) members appointed by the Board of Aldermen of the city as herein provided. All members shall serve without compensation and three (3) members shall be from the motel and hotel industry or a business directly related to tourism. The initial appointments shall be for a term of one (1) year ending August 16, 1989. Upon the expiration of the initial appointments, the appointments shall be for the following terms:

(a) Two (2) members shall be appointed for terms of one (1) year;

(b) Two (2) members shall be appointed for terms of two (2) years; and



(c) Three (3) members shall be appointed for terms of three (3) years.

All appointments thereafter shall be made for a term of three (3) years from the date of expiration of the terms under items (a), (b), and (c) of this subsection. Any vacancy which may occur shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment and shall be made for the unexpired term. Each director shall serve until his successor is appointed and qualified.

The members so appointed shall elect from among themselves a chairman. A member of the **council** shall not serve as chairman for more than two (2) successive one-year terms.

4. The council is authorized to employ personnel, obtain supplies, services, furnishings and other facilities necessary to administer the affairs and duties of the council and to pay for same out of the revenue provided by the "motel-hotel tax" and from other sources.

5. The council will make all purchases in accordance with State of Mississippi statutes as relates to municipalities. The books of the council shall be audited annually by an independent certified public accountant, and said accountant shall make a written report of his audit to the council who will thereupon submit a copy of said report to the city. Such audit shall be made and completed as soon as practicable after the close of the fiscal year, and copies of the report of said audit shall be filed with the city within fifteen (15) days after receipt thereof by the council.

6. The term of this agreement shall be for a time period beginning with the date of the execution of this agreement and ending June 30, 1991, and the council shall have the option to renew this contract under the same terms and conditions for successive four-year periods.

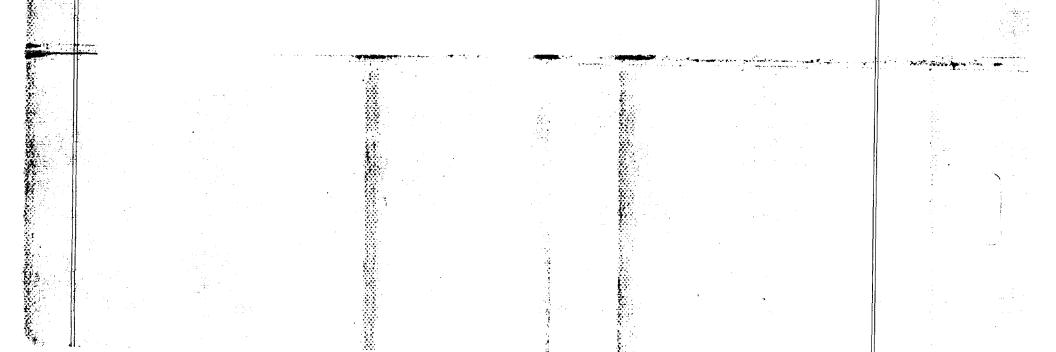

That this Mayor and Board of Aldermen will approve this Application by an Order or Resolution spread upon its minutes declaring that such property is exempt from all ad valorem taxation, except ad valorem taxes for school district purposes, for a period of ten (10) years, and forward the original and a certified copy of this Application and a certified transcript of such approval to the Mississippi Board of Economic Development, and upon approval of such Application by the said Mississippi Board of Economic Development, and certification of such approval, said Mayor and Board of Aldermen will enter a final Order on its minutes granting the ad valorem tax exemption hereby applied for.

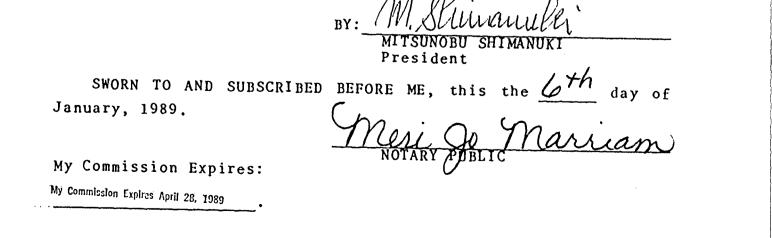

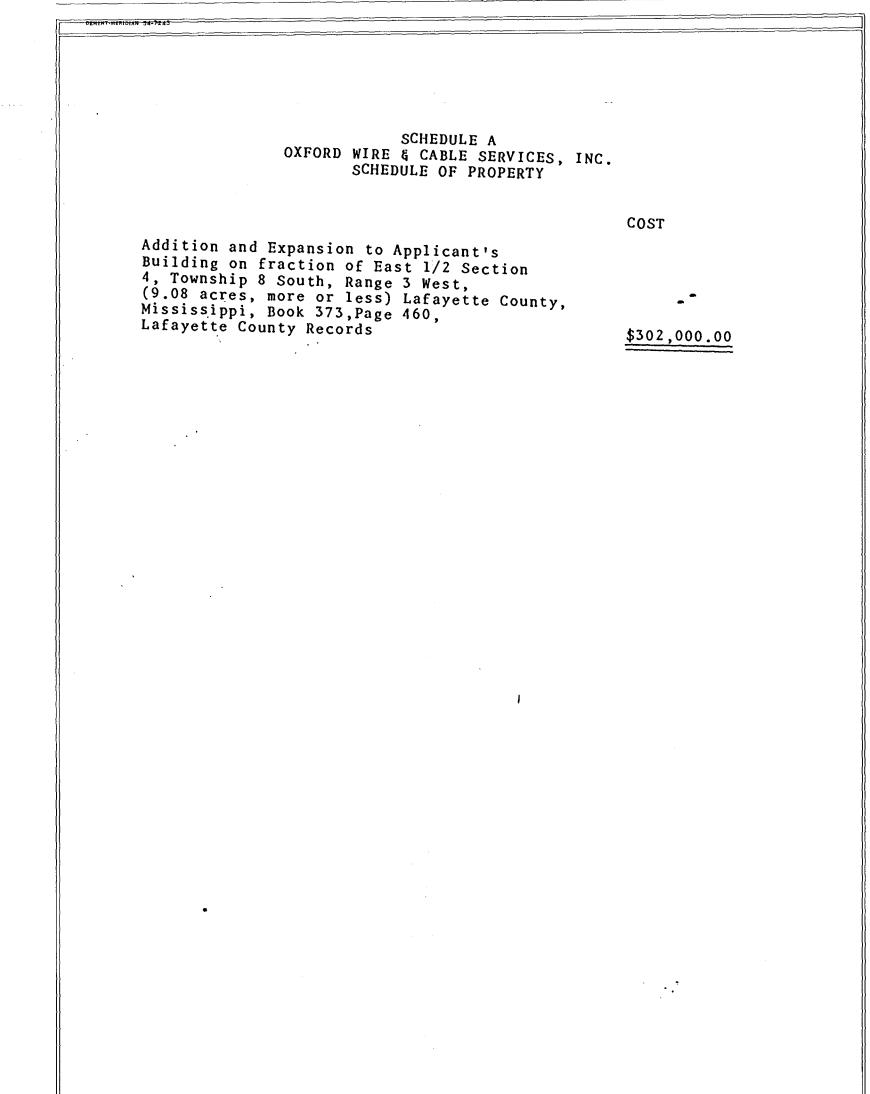

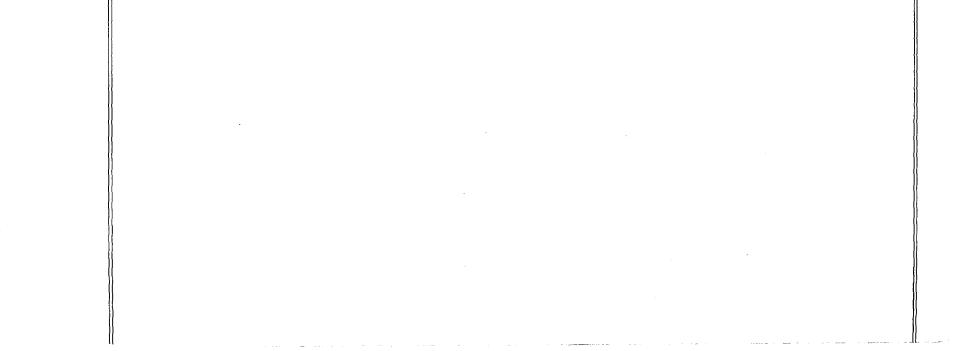
